Allied health professionals are essential to patient care, supporting doctors and nurses by assisting with diagnosis, treatment, and the overall patient well-being. With Connecticut's aging population and increasing healthcare needs, the demand for skilled healthcare workers is critical. Yet there is a shortage of trained caregivers to meet the increasing need.

Since 2009, the Griffin Hospital School of Allied Health Careers has trained more than 2,000 students with the skills to be patient-centered nursing assistants, patient care technicians, phlebotomists, and medical assistants, most of whom secure rewarding employment right after graduation. Recently, the school relocated to a more spacious facility on Division Street in Ansonia adjacent to the hospital's west campus, providing larger classrooms and patient care simulation rooms to accommodate growth in these programs and help more community members find fulfilling careers. In addition to this growth, the school proudly offers Connecticut's only hospital-based Practical Nursing program at its Naugatuck campus to further nurture the next generation of healthcare professionals.

For many students, including those who lack the employable skills necessary to earn a living wage and those seeking career changes, these programs offer a meaningful path to a more financially sustainable future while strengthening the state's healthcare workforce and ensuring high-quality care for our Greater Naugatuck Valley community. Through collaboration with the Derby, Seymour, Ansonia, and Shelton high schools, the School of Allied Health offers Valley teens certification in its allied health programs — providing them with excellent employment opportunities and a clear career path immediately after graduation.
