The EmPATH model reimagines crisis response through rapid assessment, personalized treatment, and a calming environment designed to stabilize patients, often within 24 hours, while reducing the need for hospitalization.

With open common areas, sensory rooms, private consultation spaces and nourishment stations, the EmPATH Unit prioritizes dignity, safety, and healing.
